Extension Board Meeting Minutes

"Youth must be 7 and enrolled for the current program year by January 1, in order to participate in competitive events and be eligible for competitive scholarships. Youth who are 5-6 years old by January 1, may be enrolled in our Cloverbud program. Youth will be allowed to join 4-H after January 1 but will be ineligible to participate in competitive events or apply for competitive scholarships. Anyone turning 19 before January 1, of the 4-H year will not be eligible to join the 4-H program. The latest to drop or add a project for all members will be May 1st."

STATE 4-H LIVESTOCK TEAM SELECTION

Southwind is allowed 3 teams at all state 4-H judging contests. The 4-H livestock teams will be selected by scores and participation in the following:

- Southeast Area Contest
 - Allen, Bourbon and Neosho County Fair Contests (must participate in at least one)
 - Attendance in at least 3 practices before the County Fair
- 4-H Age: to be eligible for an out of state trip, participants must be 14 years or older as of January 1.

To be clear, each county will submit their top 4 individuals from the above events, which will give us 12 individuals eligible for the 3 teams during the Kansas 4-H Livestock Sweepstakes weekend. From those 12 youth, composite teams will be determined based on contest scores, practice participation and agent/coach discretion.

STATE 4-H HORTICULTURE & POULTRY JUDGING OPPORTUNITES

If you are interested in participating on a District Horticulture or Poultry Judging Team, please contact your local Extension Office. If we can get enough interest, we will try to send teams to those State Contests this year.

STATE 4-H FCS/ PHOTOGRAPHY TEAM SELECTION

Southwind is allowed 3 teams at all state 4-H judging contests. Team placement and preference will be given to those individuals who have participated in current years FCS and Photography judging contests and practices.

4-H FCS JUDGING STATE CONTEST

The State 4-H FCS Judging Contest for both Intermediate and Senior youth will be conducted on Saturday, September 16 in the Encampment Building.

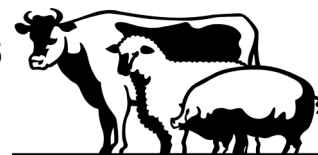
HOSTING IFYE's

WHY THE CLOTHING PROJECT?

A good KAP consists of several 4-H projects that work together. Why should you consider the Clothing and Textiles Project. Learning how to assess your wardrobe and determine your needs is a life skill in taking care of yourself and how you present yourself. The 4-H clothing and textiles project will help you acquire the skills and knowledge necessary to plan, select, make, assemble and care for suitable clothing for work, school and social events.

You can learn how to:

- *Express yourself through creating and planning a wardrobe
- * Develop skills to purchase and make clothing
- * Learn how to use equipment to make and care for your clothes

These skills compliment other 4-H projects when working on your Kansas Award Portfolio. Some examples may include:

- * Project talks, demonstrations, Favorite Foods contest, or conference judging at the fair is about how you present yourself.
- * Performing Arts participants may have a dress code, need "Sunday" clothing, or have a costume.
- * Livestock Project participants may have boots, jeans, shirts, coats, overalls, etc. that are helpful when taking care of their animals and different set of clothes when showing.
