CLUB LEADERS END OF YEAR PAPERWORK

Club Leaders please turn in end of year paperwork to your local Extension Officer by Friday, September 29, 2023. All paperwork is located on the Southwind website: southwind.k-state.edu/4-h/record-keeping/index.html.

CLUB OFFICER NOTEBOOKS

Each club is responsible for turning in their Secretary, Reporter and Historian notebooks to the Extension Office by September 29. 4-H Club Treasurer books are due Wednesday, November 1st.

RECORD BOOKS/PROJECT RECORD REPORT

Since October 1st is on a Sunday this year all records must be in your local Extension Office by Friday, September 29, 2023. <u>NO EXCEPTIONS</u>.

Hopefully you are working on or have completed your MIG and at least one PRR. If you are needing any help with completing these books or are completely new to the process, please let Jennifer, know. Record Books are due to your club leaders at their specific deadline to have plenty of time to review books before they are due to the Extension Office September 29th. Books that are turned in after the deadline of your club leaders will not be judged for county-wide awards.

RECORD BOOK JUDGING

Mark your calendar for the Southwind District record book judging event on October 1 from 1pm-6pm at the Iola Extension Office. All are welcome (parents, volunteers, and supporters) to come help with this educational opportunity. FAMILIES WILL PAY 2024 4-H PROGRAM FEE

Enrollment and payment must be complete by December 1, 2023. Due to many payment issues, all families will be asked to pay the \$15.00 4-H Program Fee per member when enrolling. It will be best to do this with a credit or debit card. This will ensure that your enrollment and fee will be processed more quickly. In December, Clubs will receive a list of 4-H'ers who receive reimbursement and a check. The club treasurer will then write a check per family to reimburse for the program fee. Cloverbuds and Volunteers are exempt. **Youth aged 18:** If you plan to participate as a 4-H member you will need to enroll as youth. If you plan to be a volunteer in 4-H only, please enroll as an adult.

NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE

The National 4-H Conference is a working conference in which youth and adults, at the invitation of the Secretary of Agriculture, assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development programs nationally and in their communities. This event brings together youth, volunteer leaders, and state and county Extension Staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the Canadian Providences. The event provides youth the opportunity to acquire practical knowledge and skills to reinforce the attitudes and motivation that will give them a heightened sense of responsibility and capacity to connect with others as active member of society. Youth will engage in educational activities to explore, practice and master civic engagement skills and personal development to make a difference in their community, country and world. Any 4-H youth member program age 15-18 may apply for the opportunity to attend National 4-H Conference in Washington D.C. area. The event is scheduled for April 19-24, 2024 in Arlington, Virginia. Applications are due Monday, October 2, 2023. Applicants are screened and top applicants will be invited for interview. Up to six Kansas youth may be selected to attend this event. One or two adult chaperones will also be selected to accompany the delegation. Chaperones must be at least 21 years old and must be a registered volunteer. Interested adult volunteers and Extension Staff should contact Beth Hinshaw or Dona Ratliff. Cost to attend is approximately \$2000. 4-H Clubs, 4-H Councils, local 4-H Foundations and local service groups have helped many delegates with this fee. Additional conference fees are sponsored by the Kansas 4-H Foundation and their generous donors.
