4-H CLOVERBUDS

As we approach the county fair season, the question is asked, "What about Cloverbuds and livestock?". The Kansas 4-H Cloverbud program is a noncompetitive youth development opportunity designed specifically for 5 and 6-year-old youth. While animals and animal subject matter can contribute to the objectives of 4-H Cloverbuds, for safety, liability, and competitive reasons, there are some necessary restrictions. Cloverbuds are not permitted to show livestock. Kansas 4-H does not sponsor or support pee-wee events or exhibitions (pee-wee refers to non-4-H age youth).

The goals for Kansas 4-H Cloverbuds include:

- *Self-understanding skills (Initiating independence and self-direction)
- *Social skills (Getting along with others)
- *Decision-making skills (Making positive choices)
- *Learning skills (Learning to learn)
- *Mastering physical skills (Enjoying constructive and creative play)

Additionally, several resources are available to help with 4-H Cloverbud programming. The 4-H Cloverbuds webpage can be found Here. Please refer to Section 14 of the Kansas 4-H Policy for further details about the 4-H Cloverbud program. Section 14.4.2 addresses Cloverbuds and animals specifically. KITCHENAID MIXER CHALLENGE

The Carol and Larry Crawford KitchenAid Mixer Challenge will be taking place again this year! Eligibility Requirements:

- Senior Division 4-H'er (age 14-18) in the Southwind District
- Enrolled in the Foods & Nutrition Project
- Submit an entry in <u>each</u> of the following categories in the 4-H Division at the county fair:
 - o Angel Food or Chiffon Cake
 - Yeast Bread
 - Preserved Soft Spread
 - Preserved Vegetable
 - Gift Basket

The winner will be determined by points system and announced in August. Look for the entry form on the Southwind website under your local fair.

POULTRY INFORMATION

Birds exhibited at county fair in the Southwind District that originates from Kansas do not need to be tested before the fair until 2027. Birds will then be tested every 5 years. If your bird comes from out of the State, you will be required to text within 90 days of the fair or show proof of a clean flock certificate.

WRITING THANK YOU NOTES TO FAIR SPONSORS

It is especially important that 4-H members write, and mail Thank you notes to fair sponsors and livestock buyers. Please make sure you take time to send a simple note of thanks to each sponsor that has awarded you with funds, trophies, banners, or plaques. Livestock buyers also appreciate it when you send them a Thank you after the sale is over and/or take your baked items and gift baskets to their business the following week rather than during the livestock sale.

KANSAS STATE FAIR ENTRIES NON-LIVESTOCK

Non-livestock State Fair entries are due August 10th to your local Extension Office. Please watch your e-mail for information on what to do!

STATE SHOW LIVESTOCK ENTRIES

Exhibitors must submit an official entry and pay the entry fees directly through each state show in which they would like to participate. This includes entries for state nominated market animals and commercial breeding females, as well as registered breeding females. A complete nomination does NOT constitute show entry. It only makes animals eligible to subsequently be entered and exhibited in each state show a 4-H or FFA member would like to participate. The Kansas State Fair Grand Drive entries will be available once nominations close. The link to entry will be available on the Grand Drive and KJLS websites, as well as their social media platforms. Typically, Grand Drive entries open around July 1. Kansas State Fair Grand Drive entries will be due July 15, with KJLS entries due August 15. Animals that are nominated, but exhibitors do not follow the appropriate entry processes set forth by each show and pay their entry fees, will not be permitted to show. Each show manages their own rules and entries. Families will log in and submit their show entries using the same exhibitor accounts they used for state nominations including exhibitor name and password. The tag number of each market animal or commercial breeding female an exhibitor would like to enter will be selected as a "validation number" from a list of nominated animals. All entries should be submitted under an exhibitor's name. For nomination questions, please contact Lexie Hayes at adhayes@ksu.edu. KANSAS 4-H WHEAT EXPO

The Kansas 4-H Wheat Expo will be held Thursday, August 7, 2025, at the South Hutchinson Community Building. The 4-H Wheat Expo is an opportunity for 4-H families to engage in learning more about Kansas Wheat and our Kansas Agricultural industry. Youth participants can take part in hands-on judging opportunities including a Crop ID contest, exhibiting wheat related projects for foods, photography, wheat variety plot educational displays, 1 lb. bin run for crops members, 1 lb. bin run for "adopt a producer". Youth may bring multiple exhibits.

2025 STATE 4-H HORTICULTURE JUDGING CONTEST

The State 4-H Horticulture Judging Contest will be held on Saturday, August 16, 2025, in Manhattan, Kansas. Intermediates must be 9 - 13 before January 1 of the current year. Seniors must be 14 - 18 before January 1 of the current year. The objective of 4-H Horticulture Judging is for members to grow in their ability to think, to reason, and to make logical and scientific judgments, through plant identification, knowledge testing and judging classes. APPLYING FOR THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE AND YOUTH LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

The application for and information about the State 4-H Youth Leadership Council and National Conference is open and available now! The Youth Council Application and National 4-H Conference Application will be combined again this year, with applicants indicating if they are applying for one or both opportunities. Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2026, may apply as a Council Rep, and those 15-18 before January 1, 2026, may apply for the National 4-H Conference. This year's KYLF delegation will elect representatives from the four extension program areas (NE, NW, SE, SW) for one-year terms on the council. Up to 6 National Conference Delegates will be selected through an interview prior to KYLF, and they will serve a two-year term on the council. The deadline will be October 1, 2025.

NEW FOR 2025! HERDSMANSHIP CONTEST

There is a new opportunity to shine with your animal care. This contest will be judged as a club exhibit and each club/chapter represented will compete for the award. **Species included:** beef, dairy, swine, goats, sheep, rabbits, and poultry will be judged throughout the fair. Inspections unannounced and unscheduled, but not during any livestock show. **Scoring Includes:**

Attractiveness – 25 points; pens and group properly identified with exhibitor names and stall card info. Exhibits organized, attractive, and eye-catching.

Management – 25 points; clean animals and pens, neat tack storage out of public way, animal care and handling, good sportsmanship, and public courtesy.

Safety – 25 points; members implement safe practices for public and animals including proper penning, regular animal checks and clear walkways.

Cleanliness – 25 points; pens, walkways, and trash around barns.
