4-H CLOVERBUDS AND SPRING SHOWS

When 4-H and/or Extension plans, organizes and facilitates a livestock, small animal, horse or pre or post-fair activity, please double check that 4-H policies are being followed. An area of concern is 4-H Cloverbuds; the program was designed for 5 and 6 year olds. Cloverbuds is activity focused, rather than project focused. Furthermore, 4-H Cloverbud members may not participate in any competitive 4-H events. 4-H Cloverbud members may showcase their exhibits at fairs and public events. 4-H Cloverbuds may not own and/or show 4-H livestock.

STATE 4-H LIVESTOCK TEAM SELECTION

Southwind is allowed 4 teams at all state 4-H judging contests. The 4-H livestock teams will be selected by scores and participation in the following:

- *Southeast Area Contest in Yates Center
- *Allen, Bourbon and Neosho County Fair Contests (must participate in at least one)
- *Attendance in at least 3 practices before the County Fair

4-H Age: to be eligible for an out of state trip, participants must be 14 years or older as of January 1.

To be clear, each county will submit their top 4 individuals from the above events, which will give us 16 individuals eligible for the 4 teams during the Kansas 4-H Livestock Sweepstakes weekend. From those 16 youth, composite teams will be determined based on contest scores, practice participation and agent/coach discretion.

YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS (YQCA)

Youth planning to exhibit in the 2019 Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or the Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS) are required to be certified for Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). **Both state shows will require ALL exhibitors to be YQCA certified. This includes youth showing market animals, commercial females, and registered purebred breeding females.**

Southwind District 4-H members have 3 options to receive the certification:

Carla will conduct two face-to-face trainings. Cost is only \$3, and youth must register online through your 4-Honline account. Tuesday, March 12 at Bressner Building in Yates Center, and Monday, March 18 at Moran. Both from 10:00 a.m. – Noon. Online certification at your convenience. Cost is \$12.

As of June 1, 2018, the Youth PQA Plus program has been retired and users are being transitioned to YQCA. Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a new national, multi-species youth livestock quality assurance program. It is an annual training open to youth 8-21 years of age and focuses on food safety, animal well-being, and character development. Kansas 4-H members may use their family 4Honline credentials to log in and register for the appropriate training. The National Pork Board will honor Youth PQA Plus certifications until they expire, but new certifications will no longer be issued.

WHAT DOES 4-H MEAN TO YOU?

Why are you in it? It is very important to really ponder the questions. What is your perspective as a parent or as a 4-H'er? Unfortunately, the main response heard is that 4-H means showing at the county fair. The county fair is where you exhibit all of the hard work and skills you have learned in specific projects over the 4-H year, but not 4-H! There is MUCH more to 4-H than the county fair. The most important part of being in 4-H is the sense of belonging you get by attending monthly club meetings. This is where families can make lasting friendships and keep informed of upcoming events/activities. Not to mention, at the club level is where youth are able to learn about how to run a business meeting, hold an office, give presentations to a large group confidently, and work on committees at such a young age.

Additionally, youth are able to learn about giving back to their communities as a club. Beyond the club/county level, there are numerous events/activities that youth and families can be a part of. Simply reading this newsletter or checking out the website will keep you informed. If these things are not why you are in 4-H, please make a point to truly experience 4-H as a family to its entirety. It all begins with attending the monthly meetings as a family and becoming more involved. National 4-H says, "4-H empowers young people with the skills to lead for a lifetime." What is your family gaining from 4-H?
