Dog members cannot just register for the KSF 4-H Dog Show without first qualifying every year. The disciplines are showmanship, obedience, agility and rally obedience. 2019 STATE LIVESTOCK NOMINATION INFORMATION

The state livestock nomination

season has arrived! The 2019 materials have been distributed to counties and are posted on the KSU Youth Livestock website, under the "Nomination Information" tab http://bit.ly/ksunominations Only the 2019 nomination forms will be accepted. The most significant change for 2019 is the addition of the YQCA requirement for all Grand Drive and KJLS exhibitors. Youth need to have completed this program and be certified at the time of nomination. Families will submit confirmation of completion by attaching each child's certificate to the Declaration Form. More specific details regarding this requirement may be found on the youth livestock website, under the nomination information tab or the YQCA tab. Market Beef nominations will be due on May 1, 2019. All other species, which includes commercial heifers, market swine, commercial gilts. market lambs, commercial ewes. and ALL meat goats, will be due June 15, 2019. Please remember there is not a registered breeding doe show at either state show, so all meat goats must be nominated to be eligible. The Grand Drive has added a doe show for 2019, so youth who would like to participate in this new opportunity will need to nominate their does. Deadlines are firm postmark deadlines. Any nomination envelope or package received must have a visible postmark prior to the deadline, or it will not be accepted. It is also important to note that June 15 is a Saturday this year, so families should be cautious in waiting until the deadline to submit their nominations. Sending nominations via certified mail is highly encouraged. Families are also encouraged to use the check list provided for each specie to make sure their nominations are complete. Incomplete or incorrect nominations will be returned to the family and cost \$20 to correct. For information, contact Lexie Hayes by e-mail adhaves@ksu.edu or call her at 785-532-1264.

HORSE CERTIFICATIONS DUE BY MAY 1

Horse ID's are due to your local Extension Office by May 1. The paperwork is available from the website: www.southwind.ksu.edu under "4-H useful forms". Before the May 1 registration deadline, you must have completed the levels required to show at District or State 4-H Horse events.

DISTRICT HORSE SHOW

District Horse Show is set for June 27, 2019 at the Parsons State Hospital Arena. Registration to come.

4-H CLOVERBUDS AND SPRING SHOWS

Cloverbuds was designed for 5 and 6 year olds and is activity focused, rather than project focused.
Cloverbuds may not participate in any competitive 4-H events.
Cloverbuds may showcase their exhibits at fairs and public events, but they may not own and/or show 4-H livestock.

KANSAS 4-H HORSE RULES

May 1 horse deadlines are quickly approaching. Let's review a few of the frequently asked questions. **Horse Ownership**: Youth may own the horse themselves, or use a family-owned horse (immediate family: mother, father, stepparent, brother, sister, grandparent, or legal guardian).

Leasing: The leasing option is intended for youth who are unable to participate fully in the 4-H horse project because they do not have access to family-owned horse, provided that they manage the horse at least 75 percent of the time from May 1 through September 30. If a 4-H member leases his or her project horse to another 4-H member, the leaser forfeits the right to use the horse.

Sharing project horses: Siblings may show the same horse provided they are not in the same class. If both are in the same age classification, they must decide what classes each will show in.

2 –year and 3-year old Snaffle-bit: No one is allowed to ride this nominated horse except you from May 1 until the conclusion of the Kansas State Fair. This includes a trainer, parents, horseless horse member, another 4-H member, sibling, potential buyer, etc.

HORSELESS HORSE

Clarifications based on learning and risk management concerning the Horseless Horse Project.

- Member does not own or lease a horse
- Intended to offer members the opportunity to learn about horses
- Member may participate in judging contests, quiz bowl, hippology and give presentations
- Member may volunteer to assist another member at horse shows and trails rides
- Member may exhibit at local fair with a borrowed 4-H Identified horse in the showmanship class only
- No riding.

CARE OF ANIMALS

Youth planning to exhibit in the 2019 Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or the Kansas Junior Livestock Show (KJLS) are required to be certified for Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). YQCA is a new national, multi-species youth livestock quality assurance program. It is an annual training open to youth 8-21 years of age and focuses on food safety. animal well-being, and character development. Kansas 4-H members may register for the \$12 online certification at yqca.org using their family 4Honline credentials to log in and register.

STATE 4-H LIVESTOCK TFAM SFI FCTION

Southwind is allowed 4 teams at all state judging contests. Livestock teams will be selected by scores and participation in the following:

- · Southeast Area Contest
- · Allen, Bourbon, and Neosho County Fair Contests (must participate in at least one)
- · Attendance in 3 practices before the County Fair.

4-H Age: Eligibility for an out of state FCS Agent Kathy McEwan will be trip, participants must be 14 years or older as of January 1. To be clear, each county will submit their top 4 individuals from the above events. which will give us 16 individuals eligible for the 4 teams during the Kansas 4-H Livestock Sweepstakes. From those 16 youth, composite teams will be determined based on contest scores, practice participation and agent/coach discretion.

SEEKING SCIENCE OF AGRICULTURE TEAMS

Teams of 2-5 youth in grades 6-12 work with volunteer coaches and mentors to create projects and build solutions. The team will identify agriculture related issues in their community, develop solutions and share the projects with the community. LIVESTOCK RULES

Meat Goats::

Weight: Minimum of 60 pounds and Horse ID's are due in the office by May breeds. There is no maximum weight.

Bracing: Must be shown with all four feet on the ground. You may use collars, collars with a short lead, or halters when showing. Exhibitors may brace their animal.

Teeth: Must have baby teeth in place with no visible signs of mouther is final.

any equal amount of hair above the knee or hock. Maximum of 3/8" hair length is permitted.

Horns: Suggested to be dehorned. However, if horns are left, they must be tipped and rounded to not less than the diameter of a dime at the end.

Scrapie tags: Must have a scrapie tag in their ear.

Grooming: Artificial coloring, paint, or powder will not be permitted during the entire show.

Wethers: Allowed to show at Kansas Junior Livestock Show. Both nannies and wethers are allowed at the County Fair and the Kansas State Fair.

Animal exhibiting cryptorchid characteristics (testicle or castration scar tissue) will be disqualified. sore mouth, lesions of ringworm, warts or infestation of mange.

Ewes and Market Lambs:

Breeding ewes and market lambs must have a scrapie tag in their ear. Breeders are the ones that should put tags in. When you buy a show lamb, make sure that it has a scrapie tag. Animals should also be free of: sore mouth, signs of active fungal (ringworm) infection, including club lamb fungus.

Swine

Must have a 4-H ID, and be free of clinical signs of infestations or contagious disease.

> Beef - breeding: Exhibitors need their ID's turned in to the Extension Office prior to May 1, for any heifer or cow you plan to show at fair. Stop by the office to pick up your forms, or call us and we will mail them to you. Physical abuse of any animal will not be tolerated and will be grounds for disqualification. Show superintendent has the right to interpret this rule.

SHOWMANSHIP SHIRTS AT COUNTY FAIR

Livestock project members are eligible to receive a County Fair showmanship T-shirt for each specie in which they Goats should be free of any signs of are enrolled. Includes: beef, bucket calves, swine, goats, sheep, horses, dogs, poultry, and rabbits. Money is donated every year by area businesses and individuals that support the 4-H livestock program. Money is used for the shirts and other showmanship prizes. Regardless of whether or not the shirts are given away, they are still paid for out of donations. A number of shirts each year are not distributed because a youth does not show his/her project animal. Club leaders will get a list of youth and their livestock projects after the Woodson County Spring Shows & Weigh Day. We ask that you give your shirt size only for the species you will be showing at fair. By ordering just the shirts that are going to be given away, the committee will be able to use funds for additional prizes. If you sign up and do not show your animal at fair. you will be asked to pay for the shirt(s).
