SETTING 4-H PROJECT GOALS

Writing 4-H project goals should take place towards the beginning of the 4-H year, and NOT right before KAP/record books are due. This publication will guide you to write and set 4-H project goals for the year ahead. Once the you have selected your 4-H projects, you should plan out what you would like to learn and accomplish. It is very helpful when this process is done with the guidance of an adult volunteer or junior teen leader. Setting measurable goals will help ensure that you have a positive 4-H project learning experience.

4-H SHOOTING SPORTS INSTRUCTOR TRAINING

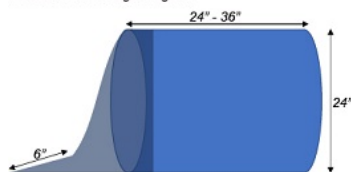

Plans are to offer all disciplines within 4-H Shooting Sports provided interests from volunteers across the state aligns with the disciplines. DOG AGILITY CLOSED TUNNEL CHANGE

Closed Tunnel Design Diagram



Effective October 1, 2018, there is a mandatory change to the specifications of the Dog Agility Closed Tunnel, currently used in all levels of 4-H agility. Rather than a long chute attached to the end of the barrel, the sheet should be hemmed so that it is no more than 6 inches longer than the height of the barrel or frame. For example, on a barrel of 24" in diameter, the sheet will be no more than 30". These changes are in effect for the 2018-19 4-H year. Judges must still incorporate this obstacle where mandatory as described in the "Agility Dog Show Rule Book, page 4."

CITIZENSHIP WASHINGTON FOCUS JUNE 13 -24, 2019

Road trip across the USA stopping to see Philadelphia, Gettysburg, the Liberty Bell and more! Meet, learn, share and tour with youth from other states and respected resource people. Walk among places that have made history and places that are making news today. Visit Capitol Hill, government departments, historic sites, and memorials. Get a close-up view of political process through visits to Capitol Hill. Meet with the Kansas Congressional and Senate delegations to discuss legislative issues. Participate in workshops and assembly groups to learn life skills and discuss possible solutions to domestic and international problems. Interact with 4-H members from other states, learning and sharing about 4-H and other interests and issues.

Applications and cover letters must be submitted online and then will receive approval from Local Extension Units after your application has been submitted and received. Applications will be accepted until January 15 or until all spaces are filled.

A \$250 nonrefundable deposit will complete your application (due by January 15, 2019) and to guarantee your spot. Checks should be made payable to the "Kansas 4-H Foundation". Full payment of the \$1850 will be accepted at any time before April 15. Any cancellation made before January 15 will result in a \$25 cancellation fee, otherwise cancellations made after January 15 will not receive their \$250 deposit back. The Fred and Doris Fink Bourbon County 4-H Scholarship will be given at the 2019 Achievement Banquet. This is a \$750.00 scholarship.

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Three or more years in Bourbon County 4-H Club.
2. Must demonstrate outstanding achievement in 4-H activities and project work.
3. Must be a resident of Bourbon County Kansas.
4. Must be senior in high school or freshman in college.
5. Must be used by a student enrolled full time in an accredited Kansas 4-year college or university or a Kansas community college. Preference will be given to student in agriculture or family and consumer sciences.
6. Scholarship may be awarded to a previous winner one time.

We will use the Kansas 4-H Scholarship Application. Note on the form that you are applying for the Fink Scholarship. You can pick one up at the Extension Office or get the form at our website or at www.kansas4h.org. Applications are due in the Extension Office by January 11, 2019.
