COUNTY FIRE BANS and ROCKET LAUNCHES

This is a reminder about Kansas 4-H rocketry rules as they relate to fire bans in Kansas. Much of Kansas is already in a drought situation. The 2018 Kansas State Fair rules state "if a fire burn ban is in effect for any county in Kansas, exhibitors in any Kansas county are not required to launch their rocket(s). All requirements for the launching of rockets for the state fair and the documenting of the launching are suspended for the duration of the ban." We advise all counties to be cautious and use good judgment in planning and conducting county rocket launches, and consider cancelling them if dry conditions warrant.

KS PLANS to HOST FLEX STUDENTS NEXT YEAR

Two 4-H families have committed to host high school students as part of the Future Leaders Exchange (FLEX) in 2018-19. Girls from Ukraine and Poland are scheduled to arrive in late July or early August to begin their school years in Kansas high schools. STATE FAIR LABELS FOR 4-H FOOD PRESERVATION EXHIBITS UPDATED

The labels for food preservation exhibits have been updated. Here are the changes:

Canning Method: Water Bath OR Pressure _____

Date processed (month/year) _____

Altitude where processed - Enter the altitude where the food was processed. In some cases, 4-H'ers do their canning project at another location, other than their own. For example, going to a relative's home on the other side of the state. So the label needs to reflect what the altitude is for where the jars of food were processed, whether in their own home, or somewhere else. Canning Method: Water Bath or Pressure - circle which method was used. If pressure canning, indicate on the next line which type of canner was used, Dial Gauge or Weighted Gauge, and write in the pounds of pressure used. YOUTH PQA PLUS TO BE DISCONTINUED

The National Pork Board will be discontinuing the Youth PQA Plus program on May 31, 2018. After this date, Youth PQA Plus will no longer be available as an option for young people seeking quality assurance training. This means that youth will not be able to certify or re-certify through Youth PQA Plus after May 31, 2018, and the National Pork Board will cease to issue youth certification numbers. However, the National Pork Board will honor Youth PQA certifications until they expire, including youth who earn multi-year certification by "testing out."

Effective January 1, 2015, contestants who have judged as an official team member at the National Junior Horticulture Association Judging Contest are not eligible to compete as a team or as an individual at the State Kansas 4-H Horticulture Judging Contest.

Looking for some new fun and excitement this summer? Host a new friend from Japan in your home, July 23 – August 17. We need host families who would be willing to host a Japanese boy or girl; most are aged 12 and 13, with a couple delegates aged 14 - 16. We need to make host family assignments matching each delegate with an American same-gender host sibling as soon as possible so that families and exchange delegates can communicate and get to know each other. Any Kansas family with children aged 10-16, who is interested in the Japanese culture, may host. A separate bed is required, but not necessarily a separate room from the host sibling. Delegates are 100 percent medically covered with 4-H insurance and bring their own spending money. They can go on host family vacations, camping trips, or join their host sibling for summer camps. FAIR EXHIBITS AND CLEAN UP

Saturday Morning July 21st

4-H Exhibitors: Please do not remove your fair exhibits prior to 8:00 Saturday morning. All exhibits, booths and banners must be removed from 8:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. The Extension Staff and Fair Board Members are not responsible for any items not picked up by 9:00 a.m. Please make arrangements with a friend or family member to pick up exhibits if you can't be there. Saturday morning Fair Clean-up will begin at 9:00 a.m., all 4-H Clubs will have assigned duties. **Livestock Exhibitors:** A 4-H/FFA member along with a parent must be with their livestock 30 minutes following completion of the livestock sale Friday night to help with loading of your animal. You are then responsible for general clean-up of your stall and removing all animals bedding to the center of the barn after animals are removed Friday evening.

Poultry Exhibitors: Pullorum Typhoid testing will not be done during check-in of exhibits on Monday night. All 4-H and Open Class poultry will need to be Pullorum Typhoid tested before the Bourbon County Fair starts July 14th. We will contact exhibitors by e-mail with the date and time for testing. **If your poultry exhibits are not tested at the designated place and time they will not be allowed to show at County fair.** During fair clean up on Saturday exhibitors are responsible for dumping cage trays before leaving the fair grounds.

Rabbit Exhibitors: On Saturday during after fair clean up you will be responsible for dumping your own cage trays before leaving the fair grounds.

COUNTY FAIR DANCE

The dance will be held Thursday evening July 19th from 8-11 p.m. at the new Terry Hubenett Pavilion. Clubs are ask to bring a dozen cookies or a snack item. Water will be donated.

FAIR ENTRY CARDS, LABELING AND FORMS

4-H members must pick up their fair entry cards and labels from the Extension Office between Thursday, July 5th and Tuesday, July 10th. Entry cards are required before judging at the fair and must be attached to each exhibit.

Clothing and Textiles Exhibitors: Please do not bring your entry cards to pre-fair judging on Tuesday, July 10th wait and attach the entry card to your garment before check-in at the fair Monday, July 16th. You will need to sew in a white cloth label 3"x2" to each garment piece, use permanent or laundry type marker and include the following information: Exhibitor name, Class number, and District (Southwind). Sew labels on the inside of each garment piece (back of neck, center back of waistband, or left end of apron band etc.)

Fashion Revue Exhibitor: 4-H'ers who pre enter the Constructed Garment Revue and/or Buymanship Revue classes must complete a Cost of Wear form and Script Information form. Both forms must be presented at pre-fair judging on Tuesday, July 10th. Forms are available on the Southwind website www.southwind.ksu.edu Fairs>Bourbon County Fair or you may pick up forms at the Extension Office. Fashion Revue exhibitors will not have fair entry cards.

4-H Dog Show Exhibitors: You will not have fair entry cards. Exhibitor show numbers will be given to exhibitors at the beginning of the dog show.

Fiber Arts Exhibitors: You will need to sew a white cloth label 3"x2½" to each piece, use permanent or laundry type marker and include the following information: Exhibitor name, Class number, and District (Southwind). Attach entry card to your garment/item before check-in at the fair Monday, July 16th.

Food Preservation Exhibitors: Labels are required for each exhibit to be judged. Please pick up labels with instructions from the Extension

Office when picking up your entry cards.

Horse Show Exhibitors: You will not have fair entry cards. Exhibitor show numbers will be given to exhibitors at the beginning of the horse show.

Photography Exhibitors: Photo mat board is available in the Extension Office for \$1.00 each. After judging is completed at the fair your photo will be placed in a plastic sleeve cover which is provided by the Extension Office.

Poultry and Rabbit Exhibitors: Fair Superintendents will have your entry cards at check in on Monday evening July 16th

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

Fair Superintendents will assign stall locations prior to weigh-in on Monday, July 16th. You will not have fair entry cards. Each exhibitor will be issued a show number during weigh-in so **please do not lose them.** The same number is to be worn each time you show during fair week.

Weigh in is Monday, July 16th as follows: Beef – 5:00 p.m., Sheep – 6:00 p.m., Meat Goats – 6:30 p.m., Swine – 7:00 p.m.

Scrapie's Tag Requirement: All sheep and goats (including whethers) must have the scrapie tag. This will include animals shown as breeding and market in Open Class and 4-H. Contact the Kansas Department of Ag to get scrapie tags.

Swine Exhibitors: You will have the opportunity to have a "wet" stall on concrete with the ability to use a mist system or a "dry" stall with the option to use wood chip bedding. Please contact the Swine Superintendent Terry Nading, 620-224-7577 with your chose.

Junior Livestock Sale: All Beef, Sheep, Meat Goat and Swine exhibitors must complete an Intent to Sell Card (Livestock Deposition Form) they are due back to the Fair Office no later they 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 19th. You can pick up cards at the judges table inside the small area before each show.

4-H members are required to sign their own card. All 4-H FFA. The sale is scheduled for Friday, July 20th at 7:00p.m. Sale order will be Sheep, Meat Goats, Swine and Beef. All 4-H FFA Members must show their own animals in the sow sale ring to receive a premium.

4-H/FFA members along with a parent must be with their livestock 30 minutes following completion of the livestock sale Friday night to help with loading of your animal.
