## FAMILIES NEEDED FOR 2019 KANSAS 4-H JAPANESE EXCHANGE

This summer inbound program is seeking counties to participate in 2019. Based on your county/district responses, Kansas will commit to hosting a specific number of youth and adult chaperones for the 2019 summer inbound program. In 2018, Kansas hosted 27 Japanese youth and adults. Participating counties get to host a small group of young Japanese teens who are highly motivated to become a member of their Kansas host family and to learn English. The Japanese will arrive in counties July 23, 2019, and stay with one family each for four weeks through August 17, 2019. Consider getting involved with your county/unit. Participating counties/units must locate a volunteer coordinator who then manages the recruitment and screening of five to six host families, and organizes local activities during the stay. Training, resource materials and some expense money are available for the coordinators and agents. Extension staff liaison with the Kansas 4-H Japanese Coordinator to conduct the program.

## OUTBOUND OPPORTUNITIES FOR 2019

Opportunities for 4-H members begin at age 12 (for Japan and Korea exchanges) and age 15 for exchanges to Costa Rica and Finland in 2019 through States' 4-H International Exchange Programs (States' 4-H). 4-H alumni 19-25 are eligible for exchanges to a number of countries through the IFYE program. Volunteers, staff and alumni over 25 may apply to chaperone all of the States' 4-H Exchanges. There are career enhancement opportunities for IFYE's in addition to the leadership and life skills development that all exchanges offer. New scholarship opportunities are offered this year. Updated applications and details will be posted on the Kansas 4-H web site by the end of the month. However, changes will be minor from currently posted documents with the exception of Finland replacing Norway in the States' 4-H Outbound Opportunities for 2019. ## TAIWAN AGRICULTURAL YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAM ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS

The 2018 Taiwan Agricultural Youth Exchange Program is currently accepting applications from high school seniors or college freshmen who are passionate about agriculture and are interested in representing Kansas in a week-long exchange program October 28 through November 4, 2018. Each year the National Taichung Agricultural Senior High School in central Taiwan hosts students from the Midwest for this program. The Kansas Department of Agriculture coordinates the selection and participation of Kansas students, who will tour agricultural facilities and businesses in Taiwan and learn about Taiwanese agriculture.

To be eligible to apply, students must be a high school senior or college freshman at least 18 years of age with a strong Kansas agricultural background and must have a valid U.S. passport and be willing and able to pay airfare costs. Applications must be submitted by August 31. Students interested in applying can find more information at [agriculture.ks.gov/AgEd](http://agriculture.ks.gov/AgEd). ## 4-H ROBOTICS SPACETECH EXPERIENCE

The Kansas 4-H SpaceTech Program and the Kansas Cosmosphere located in Hutchinson are again teaming up to provide fun, hands-on and science-based programming for Kansas 4-H Youth Development. This fourth program will feature "Robotics." The experience will begin Friday, November 16, at 4 p.m., and will end on Saturday, November 17, 4 p.m. Cost will be \$115 for youth between 9-18-years old and \$115 for all adult participants. All youth must have a designated chaperone to attend. Parents, grandparents, other relatives, and guardians may chaperone their own children/relatives. They may not chaperone other non-family members. Registered KSRE 4-H Leaders or KSRE staff may also chaperone 4-H members. Adult chaperones will be responsible for their children overnight. Registration includes three meals, two breaks, and an overnight stay. The CVent registration system will be used, visit: <http://www.kansas4-h.org/events/index.html> after October 1, 2018. Registration will close November 4, 2018, 11:59 p.m. There will be a minimum number required or the Robotics SpaceTech Experience will be cancelled.

## 4-H YOUTH COUNCIL & NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE APPLICATION PROCESS

The Youth Council Application and National Conference Application will be combined this year, with applicants indicating if they are applying for one or both opportunities.

The information link is now available on the KYLF webpage and the National Conference webpage on the State 4-H Website. Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2019 may apply as a Council Rep and those 15-18 before January 1, 2019 may apply for National Conference. This year's KYLF delegation will elect

representatives from the four extension program areas (NE, NW, SE, SW) for one year terms on council. Up to 6 National Conference Delegates will be selected through an interview process at KYLF and they serve a two year term on council.

Youth Council members work to involve youth with K-State Research and Extension in promoting, developing, implementing and evaluating Kansas Extension 4-H Youth Development programs in order to reflect the needs and interests of the youth in the state. Council members will also plan and conduct the Kansas Youth Leadership Forum, Citizenship in Action, Campference, 48 Hours of 4-H and other events.

Applications are due on an online form on October 1, 2018 before 11:59 p.m. CST and 2 reference forms must be filled out online and those references should submit a letters of reference either uploaded, emailed or postmarked on or before October 1, 2018 The signature page (both conference or council rep) and agreement page (conference only) must be postmarked by October 1, 2018, or emailed on or before October 1.

This year the Council Elections will include the application process detailed above, and from those applications up to 12 young people per area will be invited to interview by zoom prior to KYLF. From those that interview, up to 6 candidates will be selected to be in the election.
